Auditor appointment process

Online application

Auditor applications open in Waikato and Southland from early December. If you've already applied into the system as both certifier and auditor, a member of the team will contact you directly to advise on the auditor application process.

National training

National training for auditors involves two steps:

- Reading the national training modules 1 7 for certifiers (no assessment)
- Completing the auditor training modules with assessment
 - Module 8: Role of the auditor
 - o Module 9: Freshwater Farm Plan Audit Process
 - o Module 9A: Gathering and Assessing Evidence for Audits

Regional training

Information will be made available on our website as soon as it is ready. There is no practical assessment for auditors.

Regional Training is managed by the Regional Council where you are applying for certification. Once you have finished National Training, the AsureQuality appointment team will advise your Regional Council, who will then communicate with you directly about their process and timeframes for the regional training.


Getting started with your Practical Assessment

The practical assessment is the final stage of the certifier appointment process before a Council makes the decision to appoint an applicant. It is carried out on a farm which has a freshwater farm plan ready for certification. An experienced assessor assesses the ability of the applicant to put their skills and knowledge into practice in a real-world certification situation.

Steps for an applicant in the practical assessment process:

- 1. Find a farm operator who has a freshwater farm plan ready for certification (it must contain CCCV information and meet regulatory requirements).
- 2. Request your farm operator to complete the Offer my Farm form showing they have agreed to be part of this process. This form can be found on our website at Offer my Farm form.
- 3. AsureQuality appointment team reviews the form and assigns you an assessor.
- 4. Follow the steps to certify the plan. The assessor holds overall responsibility for the certification.

Note that, as an applicant, you cannot charge the farm operator for this practical assessment, and the assessor may charge the farm operator only for their time spent certifying the plan. This means that offering a farm for an applicant's practical assessment is a great way for a farm operator to get their farm plan certified at a much-reduced cost.



Looking ahead to 2024 – what to expect

Otago and West Coast are the next regions where the Freshwater Farm Plan regulations come into effect – this takes place on 1st February 2024. We will advise once we are accepting certifier applications from these regions. We'll have more information about national and regional training for these regions in our next newsletter.

Reminder of the application process

- 1. Applicant completes the online application form.
- 2. If a referee has been provided, the AsureQuality appointment team contacts the referee.
- 3. Applicant pays the fee (using Stripe with a credit card is fastest).
- 4. Once payment is received and the referee's reference has been returned, then the appointment team will start to assess the application.
- 5. Once the application has been assessed, the appointment team will either approve the applicant to begin national training, request more information or decline the application.
